



# International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program







### Understanding IB

- ★ The International Baccalaureate® aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable & caring young people who help to create a better & more peaceful world through intercultural understanding & respect.
- ★ To achieve this goal, the organization works with schools, governments & international organizations to develop challenging programmes of international education and rigorous assessment.
- ★ These programmes encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate & lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.















### An IB Education

- ★ Fosters international-mindedness in an conceptual, inquiry-based framework
- ★ Allows students to develop future-ready skills & attributes (e.g. Learner Profiles & IB's Approaches to Learning)
- ★ Engages students in broad, balanced course loads
- ★ Builds independence & interdependence in learning.





### IB MYP at Whitman MS

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- ★ MYP focuses on:
  - Inquiry and exploration
  - Learning Skills such as communication, research and social skills
  - Reflection
- \* As an IB School we focus on teaching students to be global citizens who use critical thinking skills, and are encouraged to take ownership and reflect on their learning. We do this through teaching the approaches to learning (ATL SKills) and using a balance and inquiry based curriculum.

#### All students engage in:

- Inquiry-based instruction through conceptual units

# Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology



### **TJHSST Overview**

- Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology
  - Comprehensive program that focuses on STEM
- The core skills and values emphasize and promote: critical inquiry and research, problem solving skills, intellectual curiosity, and social responsibility
- Diploma includes the completion of an original engineering or experimental research project in an on-campus lab or off-site through a Mentorship program at a government, corporate, or university research laboratory.



### TJHSST Requirements

### Requirements for 2025-2026 School Year\*

- Must have 3.5 GPA or higher (7th grade-1st Q of 8th grade)
- Must be enrolled in Algebra Honors 1 or Geometry Honors
- Must be enrolled in Honors Science
- Must be enrolled in one additional honors class or identified as a Young Scholar.




# Math Department Overview

- Place students in class with appropriate level of rigor.
- Prepare students to take Algebra 1 in 8th grade and Geometry in 9th grade.

When considering to move from on-grade level math class to an honors math class:

- → Move is called "skipping a grade level in math instruction."
- → Students may miss significant math content and concepts when moving classes.

### Math 7 Honors & Algebra 1

- Math 7 Honors follows an accelerated math curriculum which requires students to master the content assessed on the Math 8 SOL assessment.
  - Both Math 7 and Math 7 Honors prepare students for Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors in 8th grade.
- Algebra 1 Honors is open enrollment for all 8th grade students; however, there are specific requirements for 7th grade enrollment.
  - Successful completion of Advanced Mathematics Grade 6 curriculum or a year-long accelerated mathematics program.
  - Score at or above the 91st percentile on the Iowa Algebra Aptitude Test (IAAT)\*
  - Score a pass advanced (500 or above) on the 7th grade SOL\*

# Advanced Academic Program

#### Meeting our goals requires:

- Development of critical and creative thinking skills in culturally responsive learning environments
- Rigorous and relevant curriculum in students' zone of proximal development.
- Opportunities for reflection, goal setting, and exploration of passions and pathways
- Differentiation "by name and by need" to address cognitive and affective needs
- Access to an academic peer group with similar needs for pacing and depth/complexity of learning
- Advocacy for groups historically underrepresented in advanced courses (YS, 2e, ELs)

### Advanced Academics Program

#### New Full Time AAP Services with Cluster Grouping!

- Students will be grouped by AA designation together in core content classes (English, Social Studies and Science).
- Students will receive full-time AA services with students who have also been centrally screened

# Open Enrollment for Honors Classes

- Honors classes are open to all students who seek academic rigor and prepares students for future success as they prepare for high school and postsecondary education.
- Students may self-enroll in one or more honors courses in areas that match their academic interests or strengths.
- The goal is to help students find the right academic match. Students work with their school counselor during academic advising to ensure they are in the appropriate classes.

- The signature indicates parents have seen the courses.

- School counselors will visit each


